Biography

Chloé Carpentier started her career in 1994 at the French Observatory on Drugs and Drug Addictions (OFDT) where she was in charge of the coordination and drafting of the first French national report on drugs and drug addictions published in 1995. She soon took up the coordination of the Sector Indicators and Studies at the OFDT, gaining a transversal overview of the drug phenomenon at national level across the fields of social work, health, law enforcement and criminal justice. She moved in 1998 to the European Monitoring Centre for Drugs and Drug Addiction (EMCDDA) where she worked on a number of issues although her main focus remained over the years on drug markets, drug related crime and drug supply reduction, with a coordinator role since 2008. In 2014, Chloé moved to the United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime (UNODC) where she is now leading the drug research team, counting among her responsibilities the production of the World Drug Report.
