Correlation Network

- Operational Grant: 2018-2022
- Transformation into Correlation European Harm Reduction Conference
- Overall objective: Improve <u>access and quality</u> of harm reduction services for PWUD, including other <u>vulnerable and marginalised people</u> to enhance <u>policies and practices</u> that increase <u>social inclusion</u>
 - Clear focus on harm reduction
 - Link to social inclusion
 - Harm reduction in the broadest sense of the word



Objectives and work pillars

- Strengthen the network and collaboration with members and partners though solid network structure
- Monitor developments and collect information and evidence in the field of drug use and harm reduction – based on civil society perspective
- Strengthen capacities & facilitate exchange of knowledge
- Advocate for full coverage of HR programmes in Europe (health and social aspects)




Thematic priorities

Thematic priorities are addressed in all pillars

- Hepatitis C
 - Access to HCV prevention, testing and treatment for PWUDs
 - Role of HR and community organisations in the delivery of HCV services
- Overdose prevention
 - Naloxone, DCRs, overdose training
- New drugs and drug use patterns
 - Trends and developments in regard to drugs, drug use





Monitoring

- Establish a scientific expert board on monitoring (EBM)
 - Includes scientific experts and representatives of CSO's, expertise in monitoring and the thematic focus
- Develop a scientific monitoring tool on civil society monitoring in the field of harm reduction
 - Challenge: needs to create added value and should be feasible
- Carry out a monitoring survey among all CN focal points
 - FPs are essential for this particular task and need to be involved timely
- Prepare, disseminate and promote an annual Monitoring Report
 - Important output and result
