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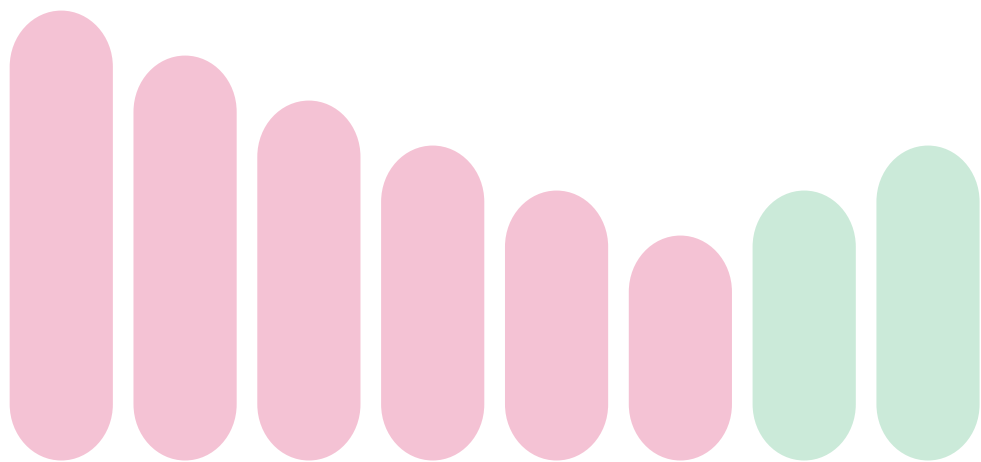

Background

EU Drug Strategy (2021-2025)

- ✓ Increasing efforts **to prevent substance use** → plethora of interventions being developed (Foxcroft & Tsertsvadze, 2011; Maalouf et al., 2019; MacArthur et al., 2018).
- ✓ Many practices → **not manualized, standardized or produce minimal or deleterious effects** on individuals' health.
- ✓ It must be ensured that these interventions are **evidence-based, accessible, and protocolized** ↑ implementation.
- ✓ **Evaluation** → essential to ensure economic resources are well invested.
- ✓ International quality standards (QS) in drug demand reduction.

Priority areas to address

5.1.
Provide, implement and, where needed, increase the availability of evidence-based environmental and universal prevention interventions and strategies for target groups and environments, in order to increase resilience and strengthen life skills and healthy life choices.

5.2.
Provide, implement and, where needed, increase the availability of evidence-based targeted prevention interventions for young people and other vulnerable groups.

5.3.
Provide, implement and, where needed, increase the availability of evidence-based early intervention measures.

5.4.
Disseminate the latest scientific evidence on prevention to decision makers and practitioners and provide them with training.

5.5.
Address drug-impaired driving.

The **Spanish Good Practice in Demand Reduction Portal (PBBPP)** represents this idea quite well.

Aims

- To present an example of Quality Standards implementation in Spain
- PBBPP is a collaborative platform between the **Government Delegation of the National Plan on Drugs**, the **autonomous community of Murcia** and **other relevant institutions** at the local and international levels.

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Method

Using an ad-hoc assessment tool, the **PBBPP** initiative reached the highest score in the drug use prevention area.

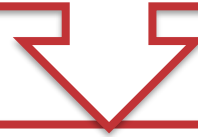

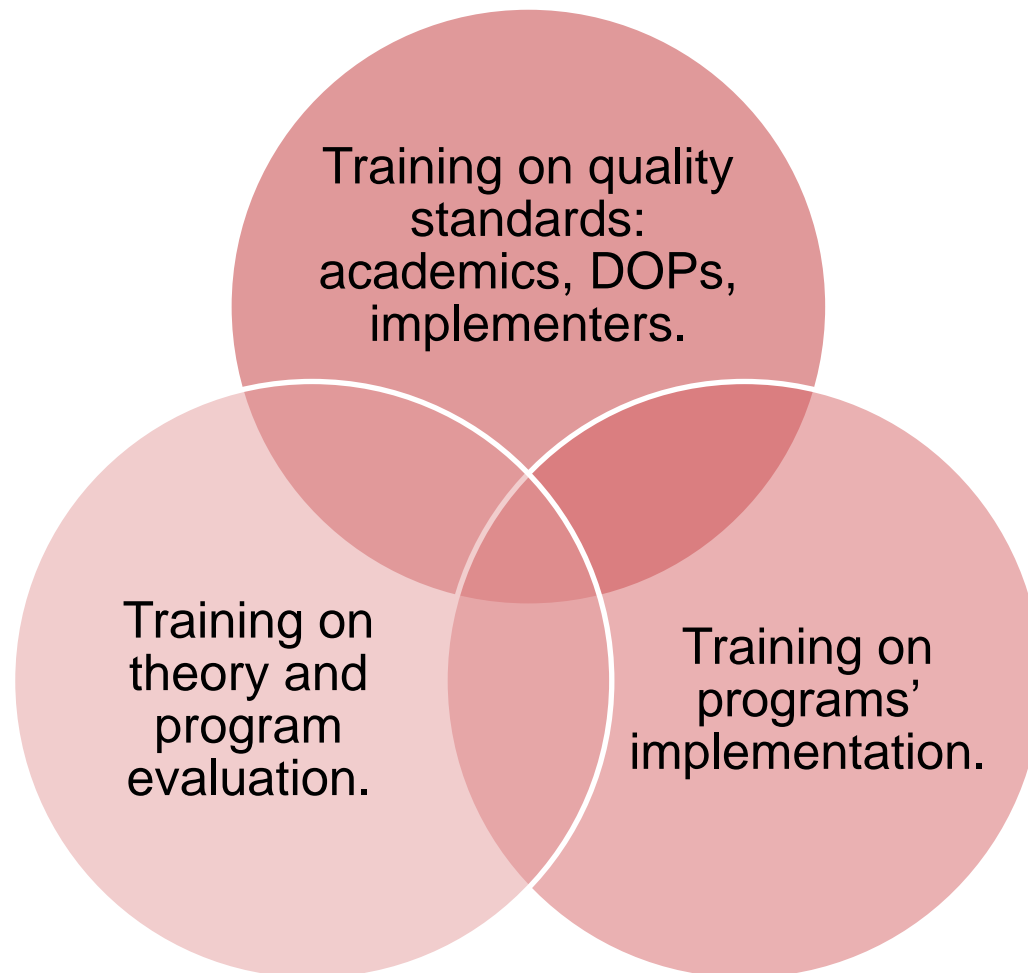


Different levels of analysis: prevention, treatment, harm reduction.

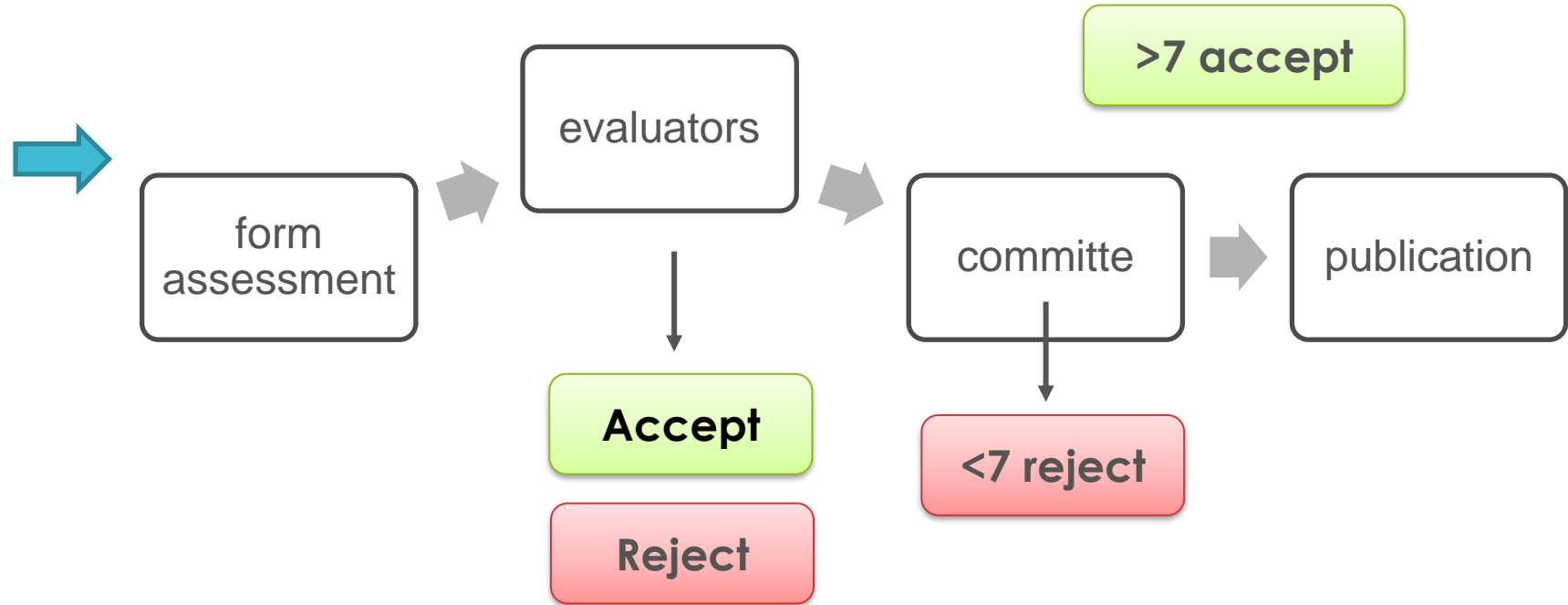
